Dear Parents and Community Members,

In the 2014-2015 school-year Sunridge Middle School students continued to demonstrate growth in both academic and social/emotional areas. School designations and levels were unavailable this year as annual testing changed from the OAKS assessment to the Smarter Balanced Assessment. Students at Sunridge taking the Smarter Balanced Assessment (SBAC) produced scores similar to students in middle level grades across the state of Oregon. The data we receive from both the Smarter Balanced Assessment and locally generated classroom assessments help our teachers make informed decisions regarding instruction for both large student groups and individual student needs. Sunridge students needing additional help in core subject areas have intervention classes strategically added to their daily schedule. Intervention classes focus on providing students with additional

practice, increased access to curriculum and individual assistance from a teacher. Additionally, Sunridge has created a number of plus or advanced classes aimed at challenging high-performing students in certain subjects.

We encourage parental involvement by volunteering, attending open house, conferences, checking student grades online or communicating with staff regularly. We look forward to another great year at Sunridge!


