Dear Parents and Community Members,

The ODE report card offers a picture of Washington Elementary School in the 2015-16 school year. Due to new legislation, The Every Child Succeeds Act, passed earlier this year, the requirements changed so there is no statewide designation for schools this year.

At Washington Elementary the number of proficient American Indian/Alaska Native students, increased in the area of English Language Arts. In math, Washington's English Language Learners and Multi-Racial sub-groups increased the number of students at the proficient level. As a school, Washington Elementary in an effort to raise student achievement, grade-level teams which include the Special Education and Title I teachers worked collaboratively to fully implement the new Common Core standards. Washington staff has continued a focus on increasing inclusive practices. We have used a "push-in" model to provide additional support during core reading and math instruction. In addition to the core

curriculum, students receive thirty minutes of specific skills designed to meet their instructional level in the areas of reading and math. The use of research based curriculum and instruction is Washington's focus. Reading, mathematics and writing are all taught with fidelity, using research based programs.

For ultimate success, Washington Elementary School believes in a strong family partnership. We encourage parents and families to be active in their child's education. Please make attendance a priority; every day counts. Support your child with their homework, academic, social and emotional growth. Know that Washington School's doors are always open. The success of your child is important to us, and together we are a strong team.

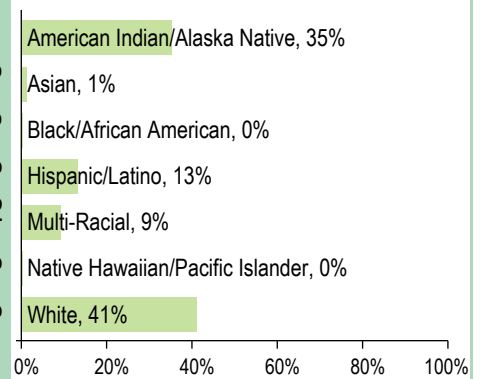

Percent of students without all required vaccines: 1

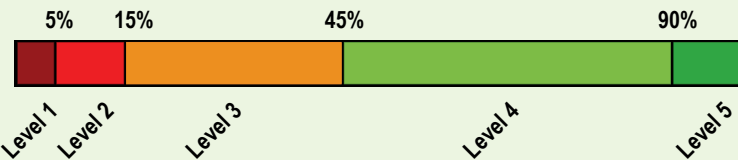
