



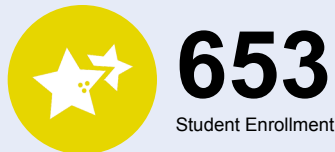

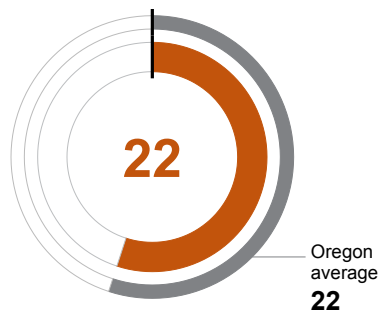

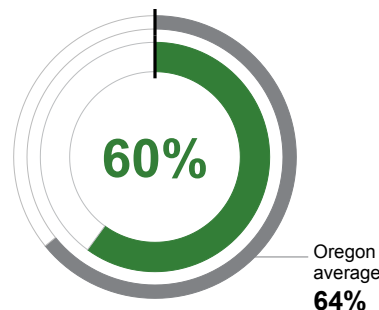
CLASS SIZE

INDIVIDUAL STUDENT PROGRESS

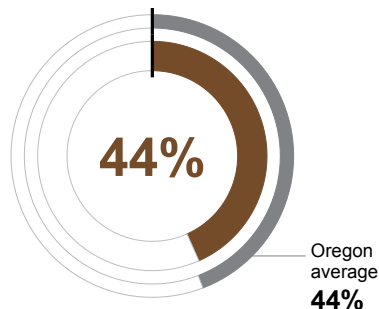
Year-to-year progress in English language arts and mathematics.

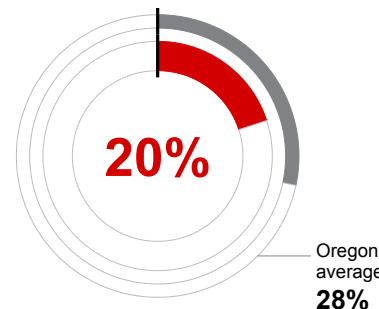
ENGLISH LANGUAGE ARTS

Students meeting state grade-level expectations.



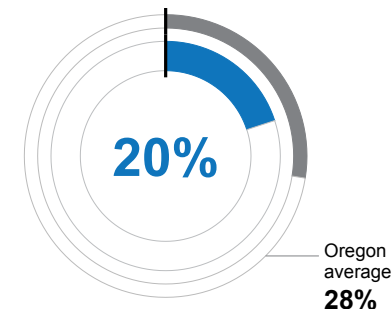
MATHEMATICS

School Goals

Sunridge staff strive to connect and build positive relationships with all students. Students who have a positive relationship with an adult attend school more often, have minimal behavioral issues and ultimately perform better academically. Sunridge staff implement a social-emotional curriculum to support our goal of creating positive relationships between students as well as with adults. Sunridge staff implement literacy strategies across content areas. Additionally, literacy support classes are embedded into the school schedule for students who need additional support and instruction in reading.

State Goals

The Oregon Department of Education is partnering with school districts and local communities to ensure a 90% on-time, four year graduation rate by 2025. To progress toward this goal, the state will prioritize efforts to improve attendance, provide a well-rounded education, invest in implementing culturally responsive practices, and promote continuous improvement to close opportunity and achievement gaps for historically and currently underserved students.

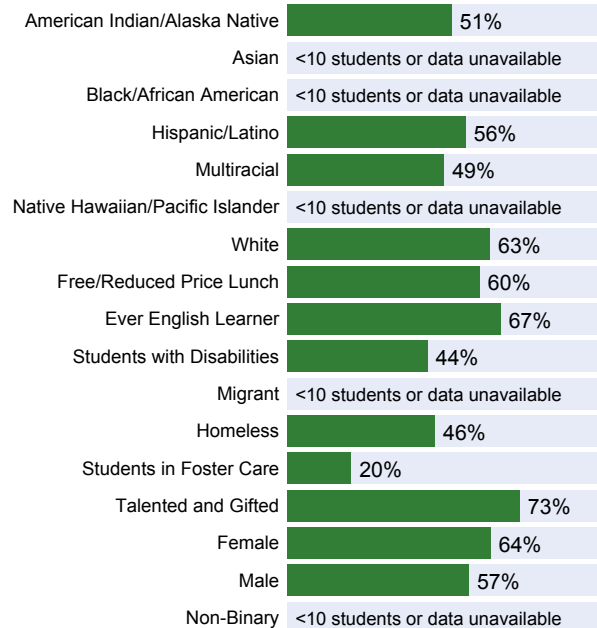

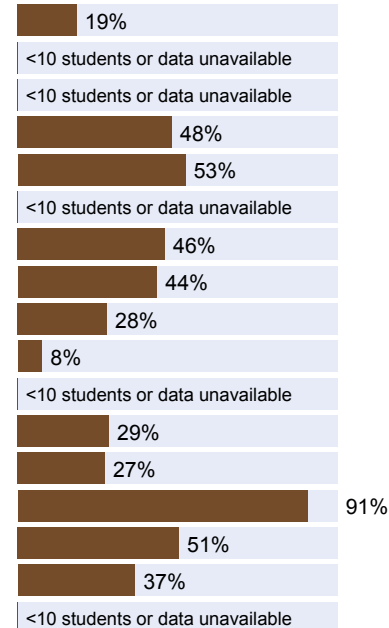

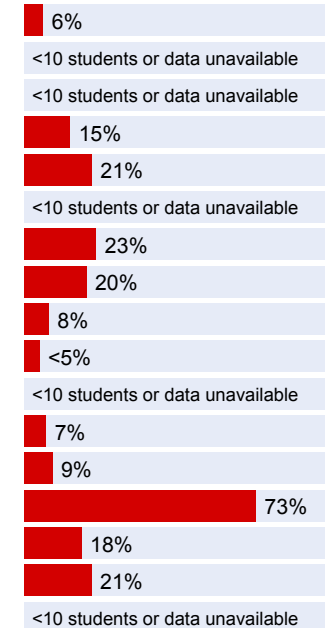
