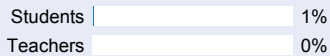

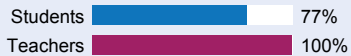

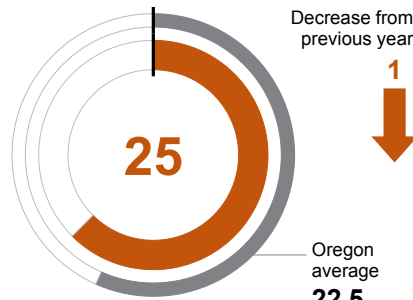

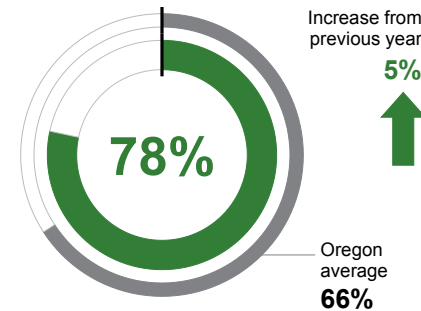

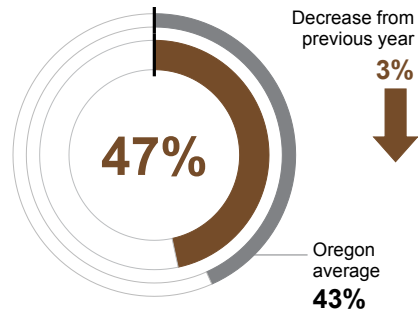

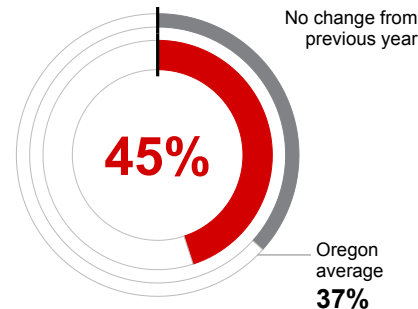
ENGLISH LANGUAGE ARTS

Students meeting state grade-level expectations.



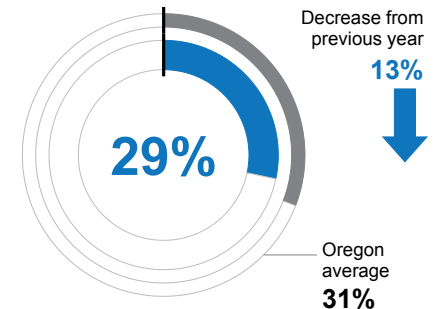
MATHEMATICS

School Goals

Goal #1 – Providing Instructional Excellence. McKay Elementary has developed a "What I Need" room designed for explicit and targeted instruction, implemented district-approved curriculum, and utilized innovative teaching practices and strategies in both reading and math. Goal #2 = Being Responsive to The Needs of All Students. McKay Elementary provides daily SEL instruction to all students and conducts regularly scheduled MTSS team meetings to ensure that we are meeting the needs of all students. The district implemented an updated SEL screener (DESSA) to ensure precise screening of our students.

State Goals

The Oregon Department of Education is collaborating with school districts and communities across the state to achieve a 90% on-time graduation rate by 2027. Grounded in the pillars of Academic Excellence, Belonging and Wellness, and Reimagined Accountability, ODE prioritizes evidence-based practices to boost early literacy, attendance, and student engagement. BULLYING, HARASSMENT, AND SAFETY POLICIES
