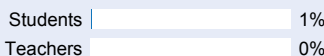

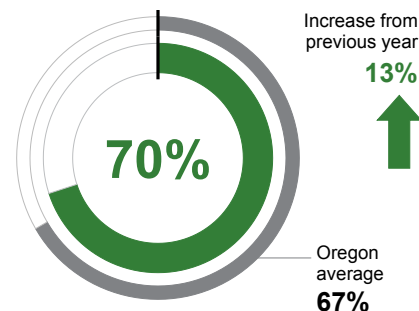
CLASS SIZE

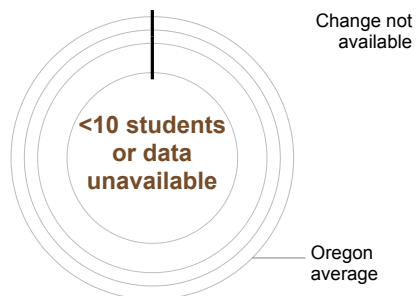

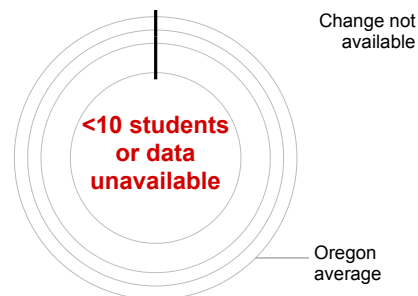
ENGLISH LANGUAGE ARTS

Students meeting state grade-level expectations.



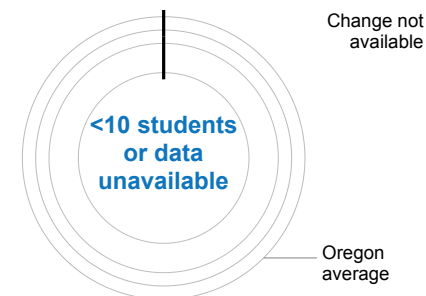
MATHEMATICS

BULLYING, HARASSMENT, AND SAFETY POLICIES

To ensure a safe and secure learning environment for all of our students, our school child development specialist provides lessons to students and staff about recognizing, addressing, and preventing bullying and harassment behavior. Our staff work with students and parents to address conflict between students and to provide counseling to learn how to respectfully treat others. We utilize Conscious Discipline strategies in all classrooms as well as use the Character Strong curriculum.

All students have the opportunity to learn about the Umatilla Language, and those with tribal connections are encouraged to learn and maintain the Umatilla Language. Parents can volunteer in the classroom, eat lunch with their students, attend field trips and events, and be part of the school family. Our school hosts several parent events throughout the year.
