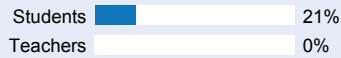

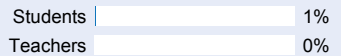

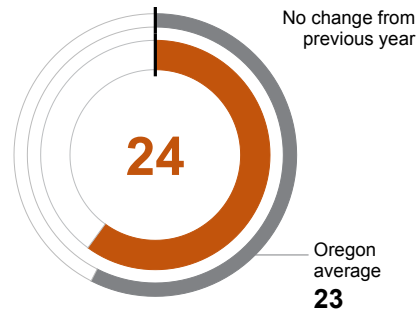

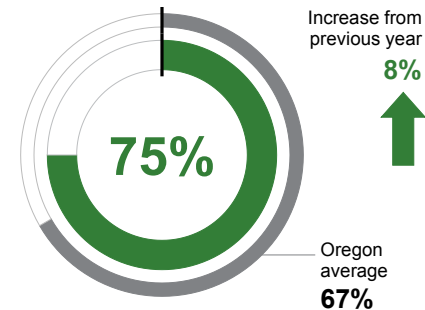
CLASS SIZE

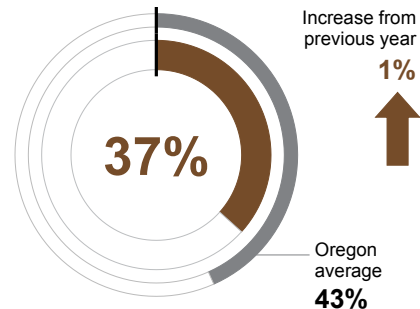

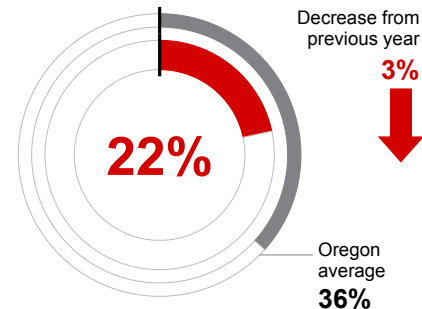

Students meeting state grade-level expectations.



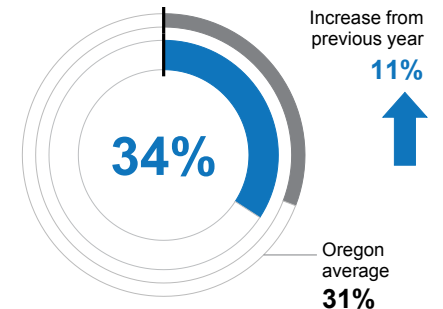
MATHEMATICS

BULLYING, HARASSMENT, AND SAFETY POLICIES

Pendleton School District is a "bully zone." Sexual harassment and bullying are against Pendleton School District policy as well as against State and Federal law. EXTRACURRICULAR ACTIVITIES

Washington Elementary has a partnership with the Pendleton Parks and Recreation as well as the After-School Program on the Confederated Tribe of the Umatilla Indian Reservation (CTUIR). We support the advertisement of these programs in our school with the use of flyers, invitations to our school community events, and word of mouth as parents seek extra-curricular activities. Pendleton Parks and Recreation offers many opportunities for our students to participate in with little cost to families, such as sporting teams and youth events. The CTUIR After-School Program as well as Pendleton Parks and Recreation offer after school programs.

PARENT ENGAGEMENT

Washington Elementary has an active Parent Group. Our Parent Group sends school wide event advertisements home via email and fliers, and is present at every family event. Our Teachers keep parents up to date with information regarding school events and student progress. Parents and guardians are always encouraged to apply to be a volunteer. We communicate through our website, Facebook page, reader board, fliers, Remind texts/messages, as well as phone calls home through our automated system and personal phone calls.

COMMUNITY ENGAGEMENT

Washington Elementary has many partnerships with the community programs and resources. We work hand in hand with programs and resources such as the CTUIR Education Department, Wildhorse Resort and Casino, Pendleton Parks and Recreation, Altusa, and Umatilla County CARE program.
